Purpose

This policy outlines the admission criteria for learners applying to HBMSU, ensuring transparency, fairness, and alignment with both institutional and program-specific requirements.

Scope

This policy applies to all learners seeking admission to HBMSU programs, including those applying through Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL).

1. General Admission Requirements

- 1.1 Admission requirements at HBMSU are published through appropriate channels and in line with UAE higher education standards.
- 1.2 Applicants are admitted to undergraduate, postgraduate, or PhD programs based on specified criteria.
- 1.3 High school graduates who have also completed the UAE National Service program are considered equivalent to UAE secondary school graduates of the same year.

1.4 Undergraduate Admission

1.4.1 General Requirements

Applicants are required to meet the following requirements:

- Hold a recognized high school certificate (or equivalent) issued by a recognized educational authority or government body in UAE or abroad
- UAE Curriculum or Equivalent: Successful completion of high school

1.4.2 Documentation Requirements

- Applicants must have all academic credentials certified by the relevant authorities.
- International certificates must be officially equated by the Ministry of Education in the UAE.
- Official transcripts and supporting documents must be submitted in their original language, accompanied by certified English translations if they are not in English or Arabic.



1.4.3 English Proficiency

Applicants must demonstrate English proficiency through one of the following options:

- Achieve a score of 80% or higher in the high school English subject.
- Learners who have completed secondary education in an English-medium curriculum are considered to have met the English proficiency requirement. However, submission of an equivalency certificate issued by the Ministry of Education is required to complete the admission process.
- If the "English 1" course has been successfully transferred from another accredited university, the submission of an English proficiency certificate will no longer be required.
- Undergraduate transfer learners who have successfully completed an English Foundation Course at an accredited university may be exempted from the English language proficiency test requirement.
- Learners from non-English-medium curricula must fulfil the English proficiency requirement by:
 - Achieving one of the following standardized test scores:
 - TOEFL: 500 (paper-based), 173 (computer-based), or 61 (internet-based)
 - IELTS Academic: 5.0 or above
 - Successfully completing an English program designed by HBMSU.
- Applicants who do not meet the required English proficiency standards may be conditionally admitted and may register for up to 21 semester credits while completing the English proficiency requirements.

1.4.4 Mathematics Requirement

- A minimum score of 70% in high school Mathematics (or its equivalent) is required for admission to all undergraduate programs.
- Applicants who score below 70% must enroll in a non-credit remedial Mathematics course. Admission will remain conditional until the course is successfully completed.

1.4.5 Conditions for Continuation

- Learners must enroll in non-credit remedial courses, as required.
- All submitted credentials are subject to verification by HBMSU.
- Learners must maintain satisfactory academic progress throughout their studies.

1.5 Master's Programs Admission

1.5.1 General Requirements

- Applicants must hold a bachelor's degree from an accredited higher education institution.
- A minimum CGPA of 3.00 on a 4.00 scale or equivalent is required.
- All submitted credentials are subject to verification by HBMSU.



1.5.2 Management Appreciation Program (MAP)

- The MAP is mandatory for applicants with academic backgrounds outside management (applicable as per the study plan)
- It must be completed before the start of the first semester.
- The program provides essential management foundations to ensure the successful completion of the degree.

1.5.3 Documentation Requirements

- Official transcripts and degree certificates must be provided.
- All credentials are subject to verification by HBMSU.

1.5.4 English Proficiency

A. Standard Requirements:

- TOEFL: 550 (PBT) / 79 (iBT), or
- IELTS Academic: 6.0
- Exemption: Applicants who have completed a degree where English was the medium of instruction.

B. Conditional English Admission:

- TOEFL: 530 (PBT)/197 (CBT)/71 (iBT), or
- IELTS Academic: 5.5
- Learners conditionally admitted to a master's program based on English language proficiency must obtain a standard English proficiency test in parallel with their first-semester master's courses in order to remain eligible for continued registration in subsequent academic courses.
- Learners may register for up to 9-semester credits while meeting the English proficiency requirements.

C. Conditional CGPA Admission

CGPA 2.50 to 2.99

- Learners must maintain a minimum CGPA of 3.00 within the first 9 credit hours.
- Courses must be successfully completed on the first attempt.

1.6 PhD Admission

1.6.1 Academic Requirements

- Applicants must possess a master's degree from an accredited institution with a minimum cumulative GPA (CGPA) of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale.
- The master's degree must be in a discipline relevant to the chosen doctoral program.
- Applicants must submit a research proposal that aligns with HBMSU's approved Research Domains.



1.6.2 English Language Requirements

Applicants must demonstrate English proficiency through one of the following:

- TOEFL: 550 (PBT) / 213 (CBT) / 80 (iBT)
- IELTS Academic: 6.0

2. Recognition for Prior Learning

2.1 Applicants without a recognized high school certificate may be eligible through the RPL pathway if they have:

- 2.1.1 Possess a minimum of five years of substantial professional experience directly relevant to their chosen program.
- 2.1.2 Fulfil all other program-specific admission requirements.
- 2.1.3 Successfully complete the RPL assessment process.
- 2.1.4 Further details are available in the RPL Policy and Procedure

3. Admission Validity and Fees

- 3.1 Admission offers are valid for the full academic year, excluding the summer semester.
- 3.2 Applicants who delay registration for more than two semesters must reapply for admission.
- 3.3 Application processing fees must be paid at the time of submission.
- 3.4 Reapplications are subject to the payment of a new application fee.

4. Readmission

- 4.1 Learners who have been dismissed may apply for admission to a different school.
- 4.2 All standard admission requirements for the new School must be met.
- 4.3 Previously completed coursework cannot be transferred to the new program, though general courses may be considered for transfer if, after inclusion, the cumulative GPA meets the requirements for good academic standing according to HBMSU policies.

5. Transfer of Credit

5.1 General Requirements

- 5.1.1 Transfer eligibility is based on HBMSU's academic standards and the equivalency of course outcomes.
- 5.1.2 Each course considered for transfer is evaluated for content alignment, academic level, and credit hours.
- 5.1.3 Applicants must fulfil the English proficiency requirements before their courses can be officially transferred. While applicants may request an evaluation to determine eligible courses, these courses will not be added to their academic records until the English proficiency requirements are met.
- 5.1.4 Graduation projects, theses, and duplicate courses are not eligible for transfer.



5.2 Undergraduate programs:

- 5.2.1 Learners must have a minimum CGPA of 2.0 or higher.
- 5.2.2 Only courses with a minimum grade of C (2.0) are eligible for transfer.
- 5.2.3 The maximum transferable credit is limited to 50% of the total program credits.

5.3 Master's Programs Transfer Requirements

- 5.3.1 A minimum CGPA of 3.0 is required.
- 5.3.2 The maximum transferable credit is capped at 25% of the total program credits.
- 5.3.3 Courses must have a minimum grade of B (3.0) and align with HBMSU's program learning outcomes.

5.4 PhD Programs

- 5.4.1 Learners must complete at least one semester with a minimum CGPA of 3.0 before transferring credits.
- 5.4.2 Transferred courses must align with HBMSU's curriculum and program learning outcomes.
- 5.4.3 Research-based courses, and dissertations, and theses are not transferable.
